Julie Mitrovich King is currently a Magistrate with the Summit County Domestic Relations Court and is responsible for handling cases involving domestic violence and conducting hearings related to family law matters within the court's jurisdiction.

Previously, she was appointed as a Magistrate for the Lake County Domestic Relations Court where she handled domestic violence hearings, dissolutions, divorce proceedings and related family law matters over almost two decades. She served as the Director of the Court's Mediation Program during her tenure with the court and established the court's Online Mediation Program.

As a third-party neutral, King has handled hundreds of family law matters to a successful conclusion as both a magistrate and mediator. King values the benefits that the dispute resolution process offers to individuals as an alternative to the traditional litigation process to diffuse conflict so that people can better communicate about difficult issues and find peace in their conversations.

Early in her career, King was an Assistant Prosecuting Attorney and Chief of the Appellate Division for the Lake County Prosecutor's Office where she gained experience in criminal, juvenile and appellate matters.

King has also taught multiple legal subjects to students enrolled in the Paralegal Program at Lakeland Community College and University of Akron School of Law. She has made numerous presentations to the local bar, higher education and national organizations regarding family law issues, mediation, and application of growth mindset principles.
